

Last year, your Chamber staff worked with the "Downtown Affiliates" and with the good folks who lead Sunbury Revitalization Incorporated in developing strategic plans. Downtown Affiliates is a standing Chamber committee that's made up of the Main Street and the Elm Street managers from throughout the Greater Susquehanna Valley. Sunbury Revitalization, better known as simply SRI, is the go-to organization when it comes to all of the good things going on in our valley's largest municipality: the City of Sunbury.

Research on popular tourism trends lead to the development of Central Pennsylvania's first and only brew trail, the River Rat Brew Trail. The River Rat Brew Trail promotes area breweries to craft brew enthusiasts from near and far. The Susquehanna River Valley Visitors Bureau partnered with the Columbia-Montour Visitors Bureau and nine regional breweries to form the River Rat Brew Trail. The River Rat Brew Trail is comprised of the following breweries: Bull Run Tap House and Brewery, Covered

Bridge Brewhaus, Rusty Rail Brewing, Marzoni's Brick Oven and Brewing, Berwick



Brewing, Old Forge Brewing, Marley's Brewery and Grille, Turkey Hill Brewing, and Three Beards at Spyglass Ridge when the brewery officially opens.

The River Rat Brew Trail celebrated its opening weekend March 4-6, 2016. Breweries on the trail offer a variety of craft beer flavorings that include: rhubarb, cranberries, fudge, peanut butter, and coconut, plus unique seasonal brews only available in central Pennsylvania. The River Rat Brew Trail name pays homage to the people who live along the great Susquehanna River and to the forefathers whose lives depended upon the Susquehanna River and who

Backyard Tourism Week Discover the Fun in Your Own Backyard!

The Susquehanna River Valley Visitors Bureau [SRVVB] will host their annual Backyard Tourism Week, May 9-13, 2016 at their Visitor Center in Lewisburg, PA. Backyard Tourism Week is a time to remind residents about local attractions, events, and member businesses.

Backyard Tourism Week will offer a variety of promotions to educate residents about all the amazing things to explore and discover in their own backyard. Backyard Tourism Week will also offer a Shop Local campaign that will encourage residents to become VIP shoppers who will receive a complimentary shopping bag and opportunities to be entered into prize drawings. 

The towns following the Main Street Approach showcase the best our communities have to offer in the way of economic and cultural opportunities and events. They provide critical support and appropriately scaled promotion for our downtown business districts. Those commercial areas overlap with and are surrounded by equally historic and wonderfully walkable residential neighborhoods. The state of Pennsylvania created the Elm Street Program to encourage the cultivation of those neighborhoods as a complement to the Main Street economic focus

In Lewisburg, the Elm Street Program is run by the Lewisburg Neighborhoods Corporation (LewisburgNeighborhoods.org) which pursues long-term planning, promotes walkability, explores conservation, and facilitates communication.

Our downtowns are destinations for the region in part because they are also authentic places where people live, work, learn, and play. Many Elm Street activities are directed primarily toward local residents, but at times they are also appealing to people in the larger region interested in active recreation, civic engagement, or service tourism. Mifflinburg's Historic 1806 Elias Live Performances, Tours, Rentals

The historic 1806 Elias has been restored to its original condition and is a unique building with a unique history in Mifflinburg. The church is available for tours of all sizes by appointment. It is also available for rent for weddings, baptisms, meetings, performances, receptions. It is a beautiful old church that seats 125 with balcony standing room for 60 and makes an elegant and intimate wedding location.

The church is also utilized as a performing arts center with April beginning its third season. April 16 at 1 pm the Bright Star National Children's Theatre Company will present "The Reluctant Dragon". The story was written by Kenneth Grahame (author of "The Wind in the Willows") and is about a boy who discovers that a dragon is living in his village – but this dragon is friendly and loves a good book. June 4 at 7 pm the Trumpets of Joy bring a traditional and Southern gospel quartet to the Elias. This group from Aliquippa began in 1952 as the Golden Bells and became the Trumpets of Joy in 1962. TIME - The Improved Milton Experience, has successfully completed its term as a Main Street community. Throughout the past ten years, many volunteers have contributed thousands of hours to utilize almost a million dollars, mostly donated, toward the betterment of Milton's downtown business district

Recently, TIME's Board of Directors, most of whom have been involved throughout the past ten years as well, has been working to refocus the group's priorities. TIME now exists as an independent, nonprofit community revitalization organization and no longer receives any state or borough funding.

Ultimately, TIME will become a member-driven organization, focusing upon the continued revitalization of the downtown as well as the greater Milton community. TIME's first priority is to continue as many existing projects and events as possible, including its most successful projects, the Milton Model Train Museum, Jungle Teen Center, and Veterans Memorial.

TIME's ongoing events include the downtown Halloween Parade, Christmas events, and the summer-long Music in the Park series, which is held downtown at Lincoln Park. This year's Music in the Park series kicks off June 9th and runs through August 4th.

TIME also hopes to strengthen its partnerships with other key organizations including the Greater Susquehanna Valley Chamber of Commerce, Central PA Chamber of Commerce, Susquehanna River Valley Visitors Bureau, and the SBDC -Small Business Development Center.

The upcoming Central Susquehanna Valley Thruway project will significantly impact the Milton community, and TIME wants to work with its partners to ensure that this impact is as positive as possible. More than ever, TIME wants to promote Milton's rich history and Milton's emerging artistic endeavors, as well as becoming a key facilitator to encourage private capital investment and economic development in the greater Milton region.

A new program, Gateways and Corridors, will be implemented focused on neighborhood revitalization at the entrances and main arteries including Front Street, Mahoning Street, Broadway, and Center Street.



Love the Grove! Dining in the Grove!

In three densely packed blocks, you'll find almost a dozen restaurants in Selinsgrove's historic downtown to satisfy your cravings.

The Selin's Grove Brewing Company (known to locals as simply "The Brew Pub") cozily occupies the ground floor of the historic Governor Snyder Mansion. The locally grown foods and, of course, fantastic microbrews account for the pub's consistent rating by beer aficionados as one of the top 10 brewpubs in the world.

Just down the street, BJ's Steak & Rib House is a local institution with its famous Chicago steak, baby back ribs and frickles. It also boasts the only fresh oyster bar for miles around. For an old-fashioned breakfast or lunch, head to Michael's Family Restaurant – try the homemade pies!



Sunbury.



- Returning again this year: Plein Air Painting, April 24th Plein air painting at various Merrill Linn Conservancy sites.




Neighborhood News


